BACKGROUND

The Texas General Land Office administers the Coastal Management Program (CMP) to improve the management of the state's coastal resources and ensure the long-term ecological and economic productivity of the coast.

SUMMARY

Galveston County is seeking grant funds from the CMP program to engineer-design and construct improvements at Gregory Park on Bolivar Peninsula that will include a restroom facility, playground, sidewalks and a parking lot. The application deadline was June 4th and grant staff is requesting ratification of the submission of the application.

The goal of this project is to enhance community infrastructure in Gregory Park, located in the unincorporated Bolivar Peninsula area, by constructing a new playground, restroom facility, parking lot, and accessible sidewalks. These improvements will provide safe, inclusive recreational opportunities and essential amenities for residents and visitors of all ages. This investment aims to foster community well-being, encourage outdoor activity, and support equitable access to public spaces.

Gregory Park outgrew Bolivar's largest festival and was left with a pavilion and a port-o-let. As one of the few parks on the west end of the Bolivar Peninsula, a lack of amenities for the community caused concern and brought the community together for one goal, make Gregory Park a destination park for the residents of Bolivar. In 2019, funds were used to build a new ball field for little league baseball. In 2021, soccer goals were added, so a soccer league could be started. In 2023, members of the Chamber of Commerce and community met with Parks department to see what else could be added to make this centralized park on Bolivar a safe and fun place for people of all ages. This has led us here to add more amenities to an ever-growing Bolivar Peninsula and with the community support, this will be a huge success.

Gregory Park lacks adequate infrastructure to comfortably serve the local community and visitors with no amenities. Now that the festival has moved, it's the perfect time to create a much-needed accessible park that serves the community and visitors alike. The current baseball field and soccer field are used year-round with no permanent restroom facility, which poses hygiene and convenience issues, especially during games and community events. Additionally, the absence of accessible sidewalks and a designated parking lot makes the park difficult to navigate for individuals with mobility challenges and creates safety concerns for all users. Adding a playground enhances growth of the community and provides a safe place for kids to go before, during, and after other games. Upgrading these facilities is essential to ensure that Gregory Park is a safe, inclusive, and welcoming public space for everyone on the Bolivar Peninsula.

The Gregory Park improvement project offers both ecological and economic benefits to the Bolivar Peninsula community. Environmentally, the project will incorporate sustainable design elements such as permeable paving in the parking lot and native landscaping around sidewalks and play areas, reducing stormwater runoff and supporting local biodiversity. Economically, the upgraded amenities will attract more visitors and community events, boosting local small businesses and increasing the area's appeal as a family-friendly destination, which can contribute to long-term economic development in this unincorporated region. While all the new amenities will bring more visitors to the park, the parking lot will serve the biggest need in getting more visitors to the park, but also provide direct benefits for the residents when there are games and community events.

Adding a restroom, playground, sidewalks, and parking lot to Gregory Park will significantly enhance access point creation by making the park a functional, inclusive, and welcoming entry hub for community engagement. The parking lot provides a safe, designated area for vehicles, improving convenience and accessibility for residents and visitors, including those with disabilities. Sidewalks create safe, navigable pathways that connect all amenities and can serve as links to nearby neighborhoods or trails, while the playground and restroom encourage longer visits, turning the park into a true destination and access node for recreation, events, and community programs.

Timeline

Once awarded, the County will go through 8 weeks of procurement to select an engineer to design and lead the project. Anticipated completion of the RFP for construction would take 2 months. Preconstruction meeting and mobilization will take 2 weeks. Project completion should take no more than 12 months. This includes the amenities selections, manufacturing, shipping, and installation. That is a total of 75 weeks which correlates to roughly 1.5 years for project completion, well within the 3-year deadline.
